Camouflaged security cameras

Piper is an all-in-one home security gadget that includes an HD 180-degree panoramic video camera that also pans, tilts and zooms—and you can even split the screen into four views. It can also set off a powerful 105 dB siren when it detects that your home's security has been breached.

Smart locks that take pictures

Having footage of everyone that comes to your door is a great way to determine who you let in and don't let in. There are many smart locks with video camera integration, including August Wi-Fi Smart Lock. If you have guests that regularly come to your home, such as cleaners or dog walkers, you can grant them access upon arrival via your phone, so there's no need to create extra keys. It's even got the ability to automatically lock when it detects you're heading out, so you'll never have to worry about whether you locked the door.
